

Welcome to MeL Databases – *MeL apps*
Michigan eLibrary
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If you can hear the music or the presenter through your speakers/headphones, your audio is configured properly. If you can not hear, please try the following:

1. Adjust the volume of your computer.
2. Click on **“Meeting”** in upper left-hand corner and choose **“Audio Setup Wizard”** and move through the steps to connect for audio.
3. You may encounter a small Adobe window opening on your screen, click the **green “Allow”** button to enable your speakers or device.
4. Log out and back in if these steps do not help or review the troubleshooting tips in the login email you received this week.

Attendees can use the Text Chat and Question box to ask questions.

Participant Feedback --To the right of the microphone is icon of a person with a raised hand – click on the down arrow to see other options. When you need to clear your status click the down arrow again and go to the bottom of the list and click **“Clear Status.” You can use this to answer yes or no to presenter questions.**

Troubleshooting Tips: *Check the main volume control for your computer to make sure it is not set low or muted. You can access this control on a Windows operating system by clicking on the Speaker icon on the lower right hand corner tray of options. *If you continue to have trouble with the audio try to exit the meeting and log back into the meeting. *Be sure to turn off your pop-up blocking software.

The audio portion of the webinar is provided using Voice Over Internet Protocol, VoIP.

Telephone audio is NOT provided. Attendees need to use their computer speakers or headphones to hear the audio.

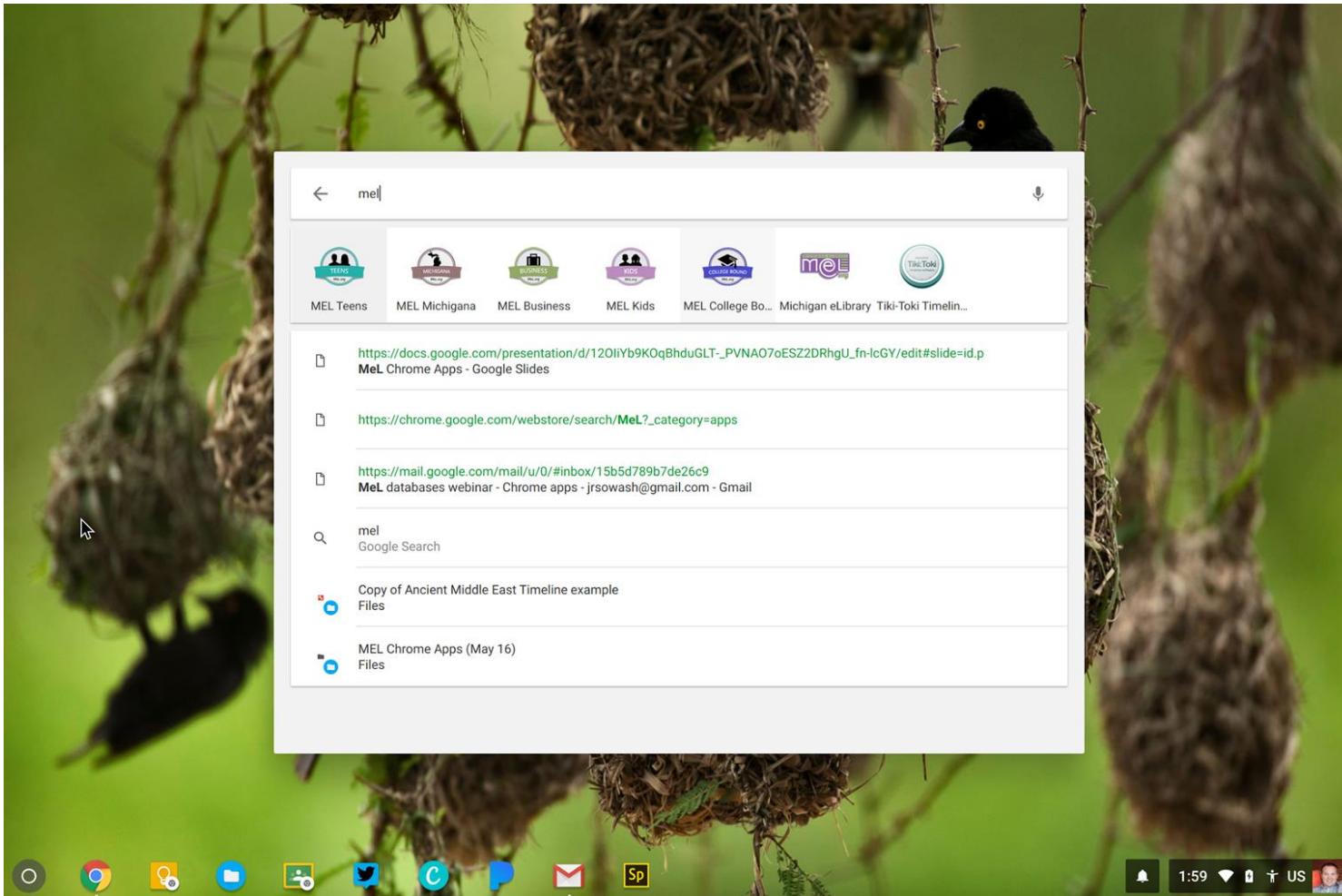

- **Occupation:** Children's writer

Shell Oil Co., London, England, member of eastern staff, 1933-37, member of staff in Dar-es-Salaam, Tanzania, 1937-39; writer. Host of a series of half-hour television dramas, *Way Out*, during early 1960s. *Military service:* Royal Air Force, fighter pilot, 1939-45; became wing commander.


Given name is pronounced "Roo-aal"; born September 13, 1916, in Llandaff, South Wales; died November 23, 1990, in Oxford, England; son of Harold (a shipbroker, painter, and horticulturist);

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Electric Cars Make the United States More Competitive

Hybrid and Electric Cars, 2015

From Opposing Viewpoints in Context

The Pew Environment Group is a division of the Pew Charitable Trusts, an organization of public policy think tanks. The Environment Group focuses on pragmatic, science-based global environmental protection and clean energy policies.

Electric cars will make the United States more competitive by reducing the economic and national security impact of America's dependence on oil. For example, the manufacture of electric vehicles (EVs) and the creation of charging infrastructure will create jobs. Moreover, investment in EVs and charging technology will make the United States competitive with nations such as China and South Korea, who are already making significant EV investments. In addition, EV investment will reduce the money spent and personnel deployed defending America's oil security and improve the nation's international influence. Indeed, the United States should pursue aggressive policies that stimulate EV demand and reduce obstacles to their success.

National policies that promote vehicle electrification are critical to reducing America's dependence on foreign oil, reinvigorating U.S. manufacturing and minimizing environmental
